Thanks to an overwhelming response, we surpassed our goal of \$30,000 for our annual fundraising event in October. One hundred guests, online and in person, bought event tickets, donated, and purchased silent auction items to raise just over \$35,000.

Employee Match Programs


Do you know that your employer might match your donations to Pura Vida? Many companies have generous matching programs to encourage and reward giving among their staff.
